Memory, Aging, and Alzheimer's Disease

Please join **Dr. Jenna Adams**, postdoctoral researcher in the Department of **Neurobiology and Behavior at the University of California, Irvine**, who works within the Translational Neuroscience Laboratory, headed by Dr. Michael Yassa. Dr. Adams will highlight some of the recent research findings on brain aging and memory from the Biomarker Exploration in Aging, Neurodegeneration, and Cognition (BEACoN) Study at UC Irvine. Her discussion will include how memory changes as you age, how Alzheimer's disease develops, and strategies to keep your brain healthy and prevent Alzheimer's disease.

The BEACoN Study assesses how memory changes are related to brain structure, function, and Alzheimer's pathology in older adults who are still cognitively healthy. Using this data Dr. Adams is investigating how activation and connectivity of the brain's memory system is related to memory performance in older adults. She also investigates how two defining pathologies of Alzheimer's disease contribute to memory decline.

Dr. Adams received her PhD in neuroscience from UC Berkeley. Her dissertation research investigated the development of Alzheimer's pathology in older adults using neuroimaging techniques including positron emission tomography (PET). Dr. Adams received her BA in Psychology from UC Santa Barbara, where she first became interested in memory research and neuroimaging.

Among her many awards and honors, Dr. Adams recently received the Postdoctoral National Research Service Award (September 2021 - ongoing) and the Young Investigator Travel Scholarship for Human Amyloid Imaging Conference (January 2020). Legislative Update for 2022

Women For: Orange County supports the following legislative bills.

** Denotes new legislation involvement since last Newsletter

AB 2203 (Luz Rivas) Fair employment and housing protections: credit reports

This bill would prohibit requiring a consumer credit report as part of application process for rental housing accommodation where government rent subsidy exists.

Update: Bill passed to Assembly Judiciary Committee on 3/24/22

AB 1949 (Low) Employees: bereavement leave

This bill would ensure California workers can take up to 5 days of unpaid bereavement leave after the death of a family member.

Update: Bill passed to Assembly Appropriations on 3/29/22

SB 951 (Durazo) Unemployment insurance: disability insurance: paid family leave

This bill would increase the wage replacement for State Disability Insurance and Paid Family Leave to ensure low wage workers can afford to take the time off.

Update: Bill passed to Senate Appropriations on 3/22/22

****Regional Advance Mitigation Policy Framework (RAMP)** Support letter sent to Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG). This program seeks to mitigate impacts of proposed projects in advance thus streamlining permits and protecting and restoring the environment. The potential is for a \$1 billion conservation investment in Southern California ecosystems.

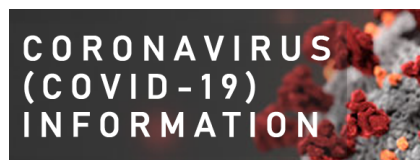
