In this talk, Professor Chacón will provide some background on U.S. immigration law, discuss how it has failed to line up with realities on the ground, and explore how we might productively move toward a more effective, realistic and humane framework for managing migration.



Jennifer M. Chacón is Professor of Law at UCLA School of Law. Her research focuses in the fields of immigration law, constitutional law and criminal law and procedure. Her work has been funded by grants from the National Science Foundation and the Russell Sage Foundation. She is a co-author of the 2017 casebook *Immigration Law and Social Justice* (Aspen Press) and of numerous articles, essays and book chapters on citizenship, immigration, border control and human trafficking.

Chacón has done groundbreaking work on mediating institutions in immigration enforcement — including local police and schools — and on the ways that immigration law and policy marginalize and shape the identities (including the racial identities) of many immigrants in the United States.
